Kia ora e te whānau,

As we come to the end of a very busy Term 3, it is a good time to reflect on the many achievements across our kura. Our students have excelled in a wide range of sporting arenas including netball, basketball, and the AIMS Games, demonstrating both talent and teamwork. The term concluded with our Art Gallery exhibition, which showcased an outstanding display of creativity and skill. This year's theme, *Kiwiana*, was especially fitting as it aligned beautifully with *Te Wiki o te Reo Māori*.

At North Street School, te reo Māori is woven into everyday learning. We celebrate and integrate te reo across the curriculum, and our kaiako are each on their own journey of growth and development in te ao Māori.

Last week we celebrated our Young Achievers, with three of the 17 students nominated receiving the top award across all schools in their category—a remarkable accomplishment we are very proud of the following: Piata Atutahi – Te Tohu Auaha Innovation Award, Asha Crews - Te Tohu Tūao (Volunteer Award) and Bella-Ne Cilliers - Te Tohu Manukura (Leadership Award).

This term we also had the privilege of hosting students from Nanmen, China, continuing to strengthen our cultural connections. I have recently met with World Class Education to discuss and plan our next trip to China. After 2026, our China exchange will become a biannual event.


